LOUISVILLE ASHRAE CHAPTER MEMBERS RECEIVE ASHRAE DISTINGUISHED 50-YEAR MEMBER AWARD

The Louisville ASHRAE chapter would like to congratulate Robert F. Logsdon, P.E. and Leonard J. O'Dell, P.E. on receiving the ASHRAE Distinguished 50-Year Member Award at the Society's Annual Meeting in Denver, Colorado during June 25-29. Candidates for the award must have been a member of the Society for at least 50 years, been a past ASHRAE President, be a Fellow ASHRAE member, be a Distinguished Service Award recipient or have performed outstanding service to ASHRAE or its predecessor societies.

Logsdon has worked for American Filter, Co. for more than 30 years and last served as a manager of marketing. He holds patents for a high velocity crimped wire air filter and a gas absorption filter. During 1978-1981 he served on the Board of Directors as Region VII Director and Regional Chair. He has served as Chair of the Research Committee, on a presidential committee on information retrieval and a committee which wrote ASHRAE Standard 52P, *Particle Size Efficiency Procedures for Testing Air-Cleaning Devices Used in General Ventilation for Removing Particulate Matter*. Logsdon also served on the Nominating Committee, the Standards Committee, the Membership Committee, the Honors and Awards Committee and the Member Council. He has served in all offices in the Louisville chapter and received the Distinguished Service Award in 1970.

O'Dell holds 15 patents for air filters, dust control products and related systems. While working as a product engineer he provided design and field evaluations of many air filters, dust control, engine intake filters and large baghouse duct collectors. He has also supervised design, fabrication and initial operation of a major dust collection facility for a steel plant in South Africa and pioneered a palletized steel making plant in Mexico. He served as Chair of an ASHRAE technical committee for Industrial Process Air Cleaning and as Webmaster of the committee. He has also served on the Honors and Awards Committee, Region VII historian and in all offices of the Louisville ASHRAE chapter. O'Dell has received the Distinguished Service Award, Regional Award of Merit, Chapter Service Award and ASHRAE Best Paper Award.
